

Child Health in the Majority World: A Billion Reasons to Hope

- 1. Overview of 25 years in Children's Health in the Majority World
 - a. Under-5 mortality has fallen from 91 to 43 deaths/year per 1000 live births. Our goal, though, is to get below 25 per 1000.
 - b. Sub-Saharan Africa bears a disproportionate burden of death and disease in children. In the next decades this will be accentuated as populations growth is concentrated there.
 - c. Celebrate that child-under-5 deaths have fallen from over 12 million to less than 6 million per year. But a significant scaling up in effort will be required to maintain our progress and further reduce deaths.
 - d. Neonatal (first 28 days of life) mortality accounts for 45% of under-5 mortality, meaning that improvements in labor and delivery have the potential for enormous impact. Additionally, almost all of the postneonatal death is due to preventable infectious disease causes.
 - e. Poverty, low maternal education levels, and distance from care are the root causes of the disease and death mentioned above.
