







Erin Meyer Culture Map






Expectations and Conflict

- Thomas-Kilman Conflict Mode Instrument








"Then Jesus said to His disciples, 'If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me.

Philippians 2:3-8

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but **in humility** count **others more significant than yourselves**. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, **but also to the interests of others**. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the **form of a servant**, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he **humbled himself** by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
