

Priest and Prophet


- Biblical priests speak on behalf of the people to God and prophets speak God's words to the people (Israel, the nations)

Prophet: Unwilling to accept things as they are "How long, Oh Lord?"





Health Care: Priestly

- Curative medicine often technical
 - Diseases of affluence
 - Diseases of poverty
 - Diseases of despair
- Losing 'art' of medicine: personal
 - Dis-integration, no mystery/faith
- Dr. Kristen Collier Physician as Priest: "biochemistry doesn't answer great questions of why and how.... Priest as type of physician under God.





Health Care: Prophetic

- In public health: reduce inequities
 - Social determinants of health
 - Environment, geography, education, poverty, health care access
- Just and Lasting Change
 - Top-down leaders, gov't advocacy
 - Bottom-up community action
 - Outside-in new alternatives
 - The last shall be first, the first, last








False Priests, Prophets

- Lies, Damn Lies, and Medical Science: reversals of findings
 - Aspirin, less fat (led to more sugar)
- Covid: mask or no, virtual school
 - Mental health, academic regression

Health Mission: Priestly, Prophetic Institutions

- Groupings of social practices where beliefs are lived out in service
 - James KA Smith, Christian philosophy professor at Calvin College
 - 'Embodied anthropology' *liturgy*
- Hospitals, Government
 - Practices can be carried out without the beliefs: hollow, dis-integrated
 - False priests, prophets: corruption?
 - Can interpret as security > service
- Church: Christians a tiny minority







Health Mission: Priestly Institutions of Mercy

Demonstrate ethics

- Quality: speed vs teach?
- Covid: patients vs staff?
- 'Insider' with national society of Ob-Gyn for fistula care, prevention
- Reintegrate: peace
 - Body, mind, spirit
 - Patient, family, society
 - and practitioners nterserve



Health Mission: Prophetic Institution of Justice

- Public health = both government and citizens
 - Bottom up: community, local elected officials, informal leaders
 - Top down: Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Women & Children
 - Outside in: transformative vision
 - Jesus and fishermen
 - Common grace, 'theology on the run'







Health Mission: Risk of False Prophet, Priest

- Volunteer service, but it doesn't make sense to tax officials
- Short term workers on tourist visa
- Covid time: national staff felt neither fear nor ideas were heard
- Staff hired/promoted on merit as professional > loyalty or Christian
