




So God created humankind in His own image, in **the image of God** he created them; male and female he created them. (1:27)

The man replied, "It was the woman you gave me who gave me the fruit, and I ate it" (3:12)








## 3 Responses to sin (Genesis 3)

Guilt Fear Shame




Innocence/ Guilt

Honor / Shame










# Caused by circumstances (race, class, victimization) -

Racial discrimination, poverty, sexual assault, performance.

#### Results in hiding, blaming & retaliation

Bullying that leads to harming self (suicide) or others (mass shootings).

Defined by worldly standards	Defined by God's standards		
Appearance on IG or Tiktok, likes on Facebook	Are they ashamed of their detestable conduct? No, they have no shame at all  So they will fall among the fallensays the LORD. (both <b>Jer 6:15 + 8:12!</b> )		
"I am not ashamed of the Gospel" (Rom 1:16)	" yet the unrighteous know no shame." (Zephaniah 3:5) "God gave them over to shameful lusts" (Rom.1:26-32)		
	"Nothing impure will ever enter [the city of God], nor will anyone who does what is shameful" (Rev 21:27)		
Caused by circumstances (race, class, victimization etc.)	Caused by awareness of our true sinfulness and rebellion  Then you will remember your ways & be ashamed (Ez 16:61)		
Racial discrimination, poverty, sexual assault, performance.	"We andour ancestors are covered in shame, Lord, because we've sinned against you." (Daniel 9:8)		
Results in hiding, blaming & retaliation	Results in conviction of our shortcomings, repentance, and life		
Bullying that leads to harming self (suicide) or others (mass shootings).	"Cover their faces with shame, Lord, so that they will seek Your name." (Ps 83.16)  "Godly sorrow (distress MSG, sadness NET) brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death. (2 Cor 7:10)






## Luke 15






## At Christmas,
